Dear Parents and Carers

It would appear that, to a large extent, some normality has finally returned to schools with very low numbers of Covid cases this term amongst staff and students. The accumulative impact of the last two years has taken a toll on many of us, however, with your support and that of my staff, I really believe that your children/our students have managed this time incredibly well. This is evidenced in their high attendance, their positive focus and their determination and commitment to simply get on with life and to enjoy it.

In the newsletter you can see that many enhancement activities have been taking place this term including an inspiring careers day for Year 8 run by the Silverstone Parks Schools Programme. We have also seen students completing their Duke of Edinburgh expeditions and individual student success in tennis and motor racing. We were very pleased to hear that 3 of the 80 music groups invited to play at the National Festival of Music for Youth later in the summer are from Spodne and our congratulations to all of those involved on this achievement.

Monica Boulton Ramos crowned ROKiT Racing Star

Racing Star has brought together pioneers in motorsport to create an exciting new talent competition in which the winners have a chance to win a racing seat in Formula 4!

Sponne student, Monica, put in an amazingly calm performance to be crowned the female winner of the Grand Final on 15 May. She wins the fantastic prize of professional driver training from the UK's sports governing body, Motorsport UK, to prepare her to drive for the ROKiT Formula 4 Racing Star team and race in the 2023 British F4 Championship.

The innovative scheme, spearheaded by former President of the FIA Single Seater Commission Bob Fernley and ROKiT, is unique to British motorsport and seeks to not only unearth the next generation of talented youngsters, but also to remove the cost barrier to compete.

"Women are hugely under-represented in motor racing, and I wanted to give an opportunity to a new talent," added Fernley, who first conceived the programme. "Monica fits the bill. She is a talented gamer and now we want to take that talent and translate into performance in a real car in the real world. It is the opportunity of a lifetime, and I am sure she will grasp it."

Silverstone Park Schools Programme

Year 8 & 9 students “engaged and inspired” as Silverstone Park Schools Programme events return!

Senior secondary school staff have praised the return of the Silverstone Park Schools Programme after three high impact careers awareness sessions between their students and local business professionals.

More than 600 young people at The Buckingham School, Kingsthorpe College in Northampton and Sponne School in Towcester were able to quiz leading figures from business across a variety of industry sectors about career pathways and future opportunities in the world of work.

Meeting with the programme’s network of business volunteers has been deliberately timed to give the students (Years 8 and 9) greater insight into the types of careers available prior to them making their final GCSE choices.

The students will also get a second opportunity to meet businesses when they are invited to Silverstone Park in July to tour companies there – many of them operating in advanced engineering, manufacturing, electronics and software development.

Activities delivered by the Silverstone Park Schools Programme (#SPSchools) at each school included speed networking and masterclasses.

Suzy Pykett, Buckingham School’s Head of Sixth Form, commented: “This is the second time we have welcomed the Silverstone Park Schools Programme and the energy throughout the event was brilliant.

“The students were engaged and inspired by the business volunteers’ career stories – which resonated deeply with many – and the range of activities.

“Teachers have said how impressed they were with the scale, impact and professional feel of the event; parents have talked of the insightful conversations they have had subsequently at home with their children.

“The experience has really got students thinking about where their interests lie, the possibilities, the world of work and how to adapt in order to pursue a career.”

"The Silverstone Park event has also been a great reminder of how far we have come. It was inspiring to have Year 12 students – among our first students to take part in the programme four years ago – supporting the event. It highlighted how far they have travelled and the responsible young people they have become."

Ann Warner, Sponne School's Learning Lead for PSHE, said: "Being able to welcome local employers into Sponne again to work with our Year 8 students has been a privilege.

"Our students engaged with all the activities and spoke positively about the opportunity to hear from people in local businesses and finding out about technologies of the future.

"Sponne School's motto is to 'Dream, Believe, Achieve' and this event helped our young people to see the opportunities that could await them and to dream of possible futures for themselves.

"We look forward to being able to take some of our students to Silverstone Park to show them local industries in action and to continue our partnership with MEPC and the Silverstone Park Schools Programme."



Enterprise Advisors Visit

On Friday 29th April Year 12 students met one of our Enterprise Advisors, Rachel Collar, a local HR consultant who gave a presentation about CVs. This enabled our students to create their own CVs ready for an afternoon CV workshop on the 13th May. Over 40 local employers gave up their afternoon to meet with our students and review their CVs to help them get ready for their working lives. The buzz in the hall was amazing and the students got so much from the event; some even securing their work shadowing placement at the same time!

Other News

Child Exploitation and Gangs Awareness Day

On 27th April we held a successful Child Exploitation and Gangs Awareness Day at Sponne School. Throughout the day we held assemblies and workshops for Years 8-10 delivered by Anton Noble and his team from Guiding Young Minds. The local police and dog handlers held an assembly for Year 7 students on making positive choices and keeping safe. Year 7 students also had the opportunity to find out about the role of a dog handler and meet Ink the police dog.

There have been many negative stories in the news recently about young people being exploited, and being groomed into gangs. Unfortunately, Northamptonshire has had a high number of stabbings and youth violence in the past few years and young people are being recruited into gangs from larger cities exploiting younger people through 'County Lines'. At Sponne we feel it is vital to raise awareness of these issues and to show students where they can access support. We have been working closely with the Police and other agencies to provide our students with the education they need to make positive choices about what they do.

Anton Noble from Guiding Young Minds is an Urban Youth Specialist in Gang culture and Youth violence. He has his own 'lived experience' in gangs, having broken free from his past. He is now acknowledged as one of the UK's leading Mentors working with young people caught up in gangs, serious youth violence and exploitation Anton won the Most Inspirational Male Role Model of the Year in Northamptonshire 2019 and was featured in the Channel 4 documentary 'Britain's Young Drug Runners', which won the best documentary award in 2019.

Students were very engaged throughout the day, and asked excellent questions.

They have reported that they found the day enjoyable and informative. We'd like to thank Guiding Young Minds, K9 and the police for taking the time to help our students learn about this very important issue.

Jubilee Virtual Balloon Race 29th May 2022 - 5th June 2022




Sponne PFA are hosting a virtual balloon race to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee!


