

Magic and Witchcraft


Read and respond to prose and play, including extracts from **Rowling's Harry Potter** and an introduction to **Shakespeare's Macbeth**

Read and respond to a range of short stories, as well as poetry

Poetry comparison

Read and respond to a range of poetry, ranging from seasonal poetry to war poetry, including **Owen's Dulce et Decorum Est**

Dystopian Literature

Read and respond to **Collins' The Hunger Games** whilst exploring the conventions of the genre

Romeo and Juliet

Read and respond to **Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet**

Introduction to GCSE Literature skills



Read and respond to **Steinbeck's Of Mice and Men**

Explore American life during the 1930s and examine themes including dreams, loneliness, equality and friendship



19th Century Literature

Read and respond to **Dickens' A Christmas Carol**

Explore the Victorian era and examine themes including poverty, fear, community and charity

Unseen Poetry

Read and respond to a range of unseen poems, as well as developing comparison skills



Introduction to Power and Conflict poetry

Read and respond to poems including **Blake's London** and **Browning's My Last Duchess**, exploring themes of power and conflict



Power and Conflict poetry

Read and respond to a cluster of 15 thematically linked poems, from **Owen's Exposure** to **Dharker's Tissue**, developing comparison skills

Explorations in creative reading and writing

Read and respond to **Shakespeare's Macbeth**

Explore the Jacobean era and examine themes including gender, the supernatural, power and guilt



Modern Prose

Read and respond to **Golding's Lord of the Flies**

Explore the text's WW2 context and examine themes including civilisation, disorder, leadership, and savagery

Revision of all Literature texts for both papers in the run up to the exams

Introduction to Drama


Read and respond to Tennessee Williams' tragedy A Streetcar Named Desire analysing how meaning is created

Read and respond to Margaret Atwood's A Handmaid's Tale

Comparative skills based on the theme of Science and Society

Read and respond to Mary Shelley's Frankenstein

Compare to a Handmaid's Tale on the theme of Science and Society

Drama

Read and respond to Shakespeare's Hamlet applying ideas from the critical anthology
