### **Why Study This Course?**

The Pearson Edexcel Level 3 Advanced GCE in Music is 100% externally assessed, and consists of one written paper and two non-examined assessment components.

Students must submit their non-examined assessment (NEA) and complete the exam in May/June in the year of certification.

## **Course Content**

### Component 1: Performing (\*Component code: 9MU0/01)

#### Assessment overview

- A public performance of one or more pieces, performed as an 8 minute recital
- Performance can be playing or singing as a soloist or performing in an ensemble. The performance must be recorded after 1 March in the year of certification and all materials for assessment submitted to arrive by 15 May in the year of certification

# Component 2: Composing (\*Component code: 9MU0/02)

Non-examined assessment: externally assessed

30% of the qualification

60 marks

## Assessment overview

- A final composition fully notated on sibelius/musescore in an appropriate style to your taste, carrying 40 marks for this component. This composition must be at least 4 minutes in duration
- Writing Bach Chorale parts in a controlled conditions test during April/May of Year 13.

### Component 3: Appraising (\*Component code: 9MU0/03)

Written examination: 2 hours 40% of the qualification 100 marks

#### Content overview:

- Knowledge and understanding of musical elements, contexts and language
- Application of knowledge through the content of six areas of study, each with three set works
- Vocal Music
- Instrumental Music
- Music for Film
- Popular Music and Jazz
- Fusions
- New Directions
- Application of knowledge to unfamiliar works

#### Assessment overview

- One written paper of 2 hours, with a total of 100 marks
- One audio CD with the extracts to accompany questions on the paper will be provided per student
- This paper comprises two sections: A and B

### Section A: Areas of study and dictation (50 marks)

- Three questions related to the set works (audio and skeleton score provided)
- One short melody/rhythm completion exercise

#### Section B: Extended response

- Two essay questions essay one (20 marks) and essay two (30 marks)
- Essay one asks students to draw links from their study of the set works to the music heard as an unfamiliar extract
- Essay two gives a choice of three questions that ask students to evaluate the musical elements, context and language of one set work. Each option will be from a different area of study

#### **Course Assessment Pattern/ Structure**

60% Coursework 40% Final Examination.
