- What happened in the 'German Revolution' of November 1918?
- What was the 'stab in the back' myth?
- Why was the Treaty of Versailles unpopular in Germany?
- Conclusions: What are the most important things that you have studied?
- What impact do you think these events will have on Germany in the years after the war?

- How, why and when did Italy unify as a country?
- What role did Count Cavour and Guiseppe Garibaldi play in Italy's Unification?
