Off Site	All Year 12 students should remain on the premises during periods 1 - 5 however, they can leave the school
Off Site Regulations	premises at breaktime and lunchtime. They must use the QR code to sign in and out of the site. All students must
Regulations	sign in and out of the school site.
Study Periods	All students have a number of study periods where they have no timetabled lessons. This is not a free lesson and should be used for independent study. Students can use the Sixth Form Area or the LRC (except for breaktime or period 4, until 12:35 pm).
Mentoring	It is compulsory that all students undertake mentoring at least once a fortnight. THe students choose this
	themselves from: subject mentoring, lower school form mentoring, KS3 reading mentoring or aiding with lower school homework club. Students have been sent a Google Form where they will identify their choice for this.
Academic	Throughout the course of the year, Sixth Form Students will discuss progress with their tutor during registration.
Mentoring	There will be at least once during the year where tutors will write a formal comment on Go 4 Schools summarising their discussions with their tutoes
Rewards	their discussions with their tutees. Students will continue to be rewarded for positive behaviour using our reward system 'Sparks'. Students will
	receive updated totals from their tutors on a regular basis. Sparks can be redeemed against a number of items
