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	Students should use the signing in system (QR Code) when signing in and out of the school site.
Off Site Regulations	All Year 13 students can come in for their first lesson of the day, eg period 2 and leave the school premises during
	non-contact time (not lessons, structured study or PSHE), break and lunchtime. They must use the QR code to
	sign in and out of the site. Year 13 students will be in ALL registrations until October half term so that all Post-18
	applications are completed. ALL students must sign in and out of the school site.
Study Periods	All students have a number of study periods where they have no timetabled lessons. This is not a 'free' lesson and
	should be used for independent study. Students can use the Sixth Form Area or the LRC (except for break or
	period 4, until 12:35 pm).
Mentoring	It is compulsory that all students undertake mentoring at least once a fortnight. The students choose this
	themselves from: subject mentoring, lower school form mentoring, KS3 reading mentoring, or aiding with lower
	school homework club. Students have been sent a Google Form where they will identify their choice for this. Throughout the course of the year, Sixth Form Students will discuss their progress with their tutor during
Academic	registration. There will be at least once during the year where tutors will write a formal comment on Go 4 Schools
Mentoring	summarising their discussions with their tutees.
Rewards	Students will continue to be rewarded for positive behaviour using Sparks our reward system. Students will receive
	updated totals from their tutors on a regular basis. Sparks can be redeemed against a number of items including
	high street vouchers and towards Summer Ball tickets (Covid dependent). We are also introducing 'Student of the
	Term', whereby all subject teachers will give a name of an outstanding student in both Year 12 and 13. These
	names will then be put into a prize draw and two chosen to receive a prize. The other nominees will receive a
	positive letter home regarding their achievement.
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Lockers	Limited lockers are available for students. The cost of renting a locker will be £5.00 (price includes the padlock) for
0.11	the duration of their time in Sixth Form and this should be available to pay on TSCO early September.
Cashless catering	Year 13 students can continue to use the canteen via cashless catering , which can be topped up on TSCO.

Go4Schools	Go4Schools is a web-based program that provides information to teachers, students and parents on the attendance, behaviour and progress of your child. It also has a homework diary with details of tasks to be completed and an archive of reports throughout the year. As the program is web based the information is live and is constantly being updated so that you can always have a clear picture of how your young person is at school. Access to this information is gained by ensuring that we have a valid email address registered with us. You can then set up your account by going to www.go4schools.com and clicking on the parent button in the top right hand corner and following the instructions.
