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### **Dear Parents and Carers**

Welcome to our first newsletter of 2023. I hope you enjoy reading about all the fantastic activities and achievements of our students during the past 6 weeks.

As you can imagine this part of the academic year is the most important and busiest time for Year 11 and 13 students. Many subjects will be completing the teaching content in the run up to Easter and revision will be beginning in earnest. Many students find this quite stressful and struggle to understand the techniques that work best for them with regards to learning everything they need to know. Please do encourage them to seek our support and guidance if you recognise that this is an issue for your son/daughter. There are lots of intervention opportunities for the students and all our staff are happy to help them with organisation and revision. Our pastoral team are particularly experienced at providing this support and all members of the senior team are involved in mentoring individuals as required. I have no doubt that the vast majority of students will be

successful because they have worked hard throughout their school careers, despite the disruption that has occurred and because they are so positive and focussed in lessons at school.

Of course, school is not just about academic performance and we value the tremendous achievements that students gain in sport, music and many other areas as well as the contributions that many of them make to our community. You will be pleased to read that the U16 netball team has qualified for the national finals and there have been many other significant successes this term, well done to all those young people who have been involved.

Last week we had significant disruption to learning due to the NEU teachers strike. This dispute is mainly due to the erosion of pay since 2010 and the significant increase in workloads since the pandemic. Like nurses, no teacher chooses to strike lightly, but unfortunately the Government has failed to engage in meaningful, positive discussions so far. Further strike days are planned on Wednesday 1st, Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March. It is likely that face-to-face teaching will be prioritised again for those students in Year 11 and 13 who are sitting their final exams in the summer but I will write to you after half term to clarify the arrangements.

Finally this weekend saw the return of the 'Last Night of the Proms' concert at Whittlebury Hall involving many students from Sponne, supported by the Kidlington Brass Band. Thank you to all those students, staff and parents who took part in this fabulous event.

My best wishes to you all for the half term break and I look forward to seeing students back at school on Monday 20th February.

# GCSE English Literature: May 2023

With the English Literature GCSE exams fast approaching for our Year 10 students, we wanted to share all of the fantastic opportunities which are available to our Sponne students to help them in reaching their full potential

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We will continue to offer our 'Brainy Breakfasts' to students on the mornings of their exams, including their mocks. These sessions are an invaluable opportunity to recap what students need to do in their exams and, in doing so, boost their confidence.

In the run up to the exam, we will be showing the film adaptations of each of our Literature texts, after school in W25 on Tuesdays, providing students with the opportunity to recap the plot and characters. We're currently showing the Royal Shakespeare Company's 2018 adaptation of Macbeth.





Each Tuesday, our English team will be offering intervention: for some this will be targeted, but all our welcome.

This year has also seen the launch of our Masterclasses: designed to develop students' conceptualised responses to the texts studied. These sessions are targeted at our students who are expected to achieve grade 7 and above.





Additionally, the students have a whole host of revision materials instantly available on the GCSE English Revision classroom on Google Classroom. Here they will find practice questions, knowledge organisers, revision guides and videos, and much more.

### **U16 Regional Netball Success**

After the high of 2022 when the Sponne School U16 Netball team reached the National School Netball Finals, the 2023 squad were hopeful to match this success by qualifying yet again at this year's regional competition. There was much anticipation on the day, especially with the knowledge that in the first round, (a round-robin within a group of five) Sponne would be facing the team they lost to in the previous year. This, however, did not stop Sponne and after winning all matches but one, a place had been secured in the semi-finals. This was a must win game to ensure qualification. The next 14 minutes of netball were certainly nerve-wracking for the many supporting parents, coaches, and team mates on the sidelines. Several times Sponne drew level with the fierce competition but ultimately Sponne emerged victorious; a 10-8 win, earning the team a place at the U16 National Schools Netball Finals for the second year running!

On the 11th of March, the Sponne School team will be heading up to Oundle School again, for an unforgettable experience competing amongst the top 18 teams in the country.

Phoebe Boyle (captain) said "I am truly in awe of the effort I know we all put in to earn our place at Nationals. After missing out on the U14 Regionals and Nationals experience due to the pandemic, we knew we had to take this chance and run with it. I am so proud of the team for working together and leaving everything on the courts in order to achieve our joint goal!"

Coaches Miss Stone and Mrs Wade mentioned "The cohesion and togetherness the team showed throughout the competition was outstanding, every player fulfilled a role and played a part in their success. Players dedication and determination leading up to the competition was admirable and we congratulate the team on this. We look forward to supporting you in preparation for nationals! 
