<p>Individual liberty</p> 	<p>Students learn about diversity and therefore the freedom of others to live as they wish. Students are encouraged to ask questions, make independent choices, and to share their views on a range of topics.</p>
<p>Mutual Respect</p> 	<p>Students develop their oracy skills through presentations and debates, therefore learning to listen respectfully to each other and to consider others' point of view.</p>
<p>Democracy</p> 	<p>Students learn about political systems in the UK when they study the Education topic in Year 12. Democracy is one of the key words they study.</p>
<p>Freedom of faiths and beliefs</p> 	<p>Students learn about different religious and cultural beliefs, particularly during the unit on The Family as well as Beliefs in Society.</p>
<p>The rule of law</p> 	<p>Students learn about different laws, particularly in the Crime and Deviance unit. They find out about different methods of social control.</p>
