Fundamental British Values in English

Individual liberty



Students will have opportunities express their own personal views in a variety of units, developing the awareness of how to express their views without impacting on the rights and views of others. Student learn about the importance of individual liberty when studying the text 'I am Malala'

Mutual Respect



The core values of mutual respect are promoted in English lessons to encourage participation by all. Everyone is supported to engage and speak up. Ideas will be considered equally and with care for the respect of individual views.

Democracy



Every student has an opportunity to share their ideas freely without judgement within lessons and through debates and exploration of set texts students are able to develop their understanding of the need to listen to a diverse range of views and respect them even if they are different from their own.

Freedom of faiths



Through set texts and poetry students are exposed to a range of views from authors of different faiths and beliefs. Students are able to express their own faiths and beliefs through creative work and are encouraged to expand their understanding of the world through their personal reading.

The rule of law



Many learning opportunities in English allow students to discuss British laws and through set texts understand how British society has changed from Victorian times to modern day.
