A Day of Inspiration at Sponne school with Baron Professor Robert Winston



On Thursday, Sponne Sixth Form and Year 11 science students had the incredible opportunity to hear from the world-renowned scientist, clinician, and broadcaster, Baron Professor Robert Winston! Over 270 students plus staff were captivated by his fascinating insights into scientific innovation, his ground-breaking work in fertility, and his journey as a leading figure in the scientific community.

The session was not only informative but truly inspiring with Sponne students asking thought-provoking questions to make their teachers proud.

After a lively Q&A, Professor Winston spent the afternoon with Year 5 and 6 students at Towcester CE Primary school, where he sparked curiosity and excitement about science in the next generation.

Leadership at Sponne school stated,'We feel immensely privileged to host such a distinguished guest and extend our heartfelt thanks to Ms. Celia Stanworth from our science department for organizing this unforgettable day'.

Review by Enzo Burgazzi (Year 13):

Sir Robert Winston is undeniably one of the most acclaimed figureheads in the modern era of science, renowned worldwide for his profound and detailed knowledge of the scientific field. During his lecture he seamlessly intertwined the complexities of the world of science with the intricate nature of morality. Sharing insights of his pioneering work into pre-implantation genetic diagnosis and explaining how he and his expert team managed to develop the first ever successful IVF treatment, doing what many considered impossible.

What struck me most was this man's humility. Despite his numerous awards and ever present seat in parliament, Professor Winston remains grounded and respectful. He took time to engage with students before and after the talk, offering valuable advice on personal development and his scientific knowledge. I must admit, I didn't know of Sir Robert Winston prior to the lecture, but in the space of under an hour, it became clear he is truly a remarkable man who's deserving of all the praise he has received. Furthermore I would like to finish by stating how much of an honour it was to hear him speak.

Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader is the reading programme we use to help Year 7 and 8 students improve their reading, vocabulary and comprehension skills. Almost all students have now completed their first reading assessment which establishes the optimum reading range for improving their learning. As soon as they finish a book, students are encouraged to answer questions about it by taking a multiple choice quiz and earn points for every quiz they pass.



We' we been so impressed at the progress students have made so far, particularly Lily Phillips, Arthur Kukeli, Jake Hodges, Riley Thomas, Camden Oakes, Lillie Rutter, Oscar Venn, George Song, Paige Hodgkinson and Bryony Emm, who have all found their way onto our Star Reader display for term 1 for having passed several quizzes and passed every one they' we attempted! Our Year 7 students have already amassed a total reading

word count of 8,874,363 and have passed 398 quizzes between them. Other Y7 top quizzers this term are Lennox Barnett, Jake Cowley, Ryan West, Charlotte Porter, India P, Ayaz Miz yev, Afiyah K, Gabriel Ellis and Toby D. They have all passed over 5 or more quizzes each. We also have several students who have achieved the milestone of reading more than 250,000 words! These include Arthur Kukeli, Lennox Barnett, Eleanor Rumbell, Alice Ramplin, Riley Thomas, Miller Hartley and Gabriel Ellis.

Year 8 students, who have only had one LRC lesson this term, have read a total of 3,584,268 words and passed 94 quizzes. Of our Y8 star readers, **Lillie, Paige and George** have also surpassed 250,000 words read, so well done to them! All students who achieve 100% in a quiz and who meet their AR points targets receive rewards, including Sparks and small stationery prizes. Well done to all of our students for their outstanding effort this term!

Sponne Environment Club

Sponne School's Environment Club started to make changes in the school's community last year with many projects aiming to reduce consumption, reuse resources and help sustain the nature and wildlife within Sponne. Although our projects have started small, we have ambitious aims this year to make an even bigger impact.

Bookcase Swap Shop



Last year, we utilised a bookcase in the sixth form area to act as a book swap for year 12 & 13 students, encouraging our classmates to donate their unwanted books to the book swap, giving them new use and preventing them from ending up unused in landfill.

Choosing to read a used book over a new book reduces the number of trees felled for paper and results in less than one fifth of the carbon emissions.

We were also aiming to encourage reading in older children who no longer have the structured time during form to "flip" through a book. It took some time to gain traction but now our book swap seems well used. We are aiming to create book swaps for all students at Sponne this year and make the school's reading even more sustainable, please ask your Sponne children to watch this space.

Revision Guide Donations - Recycling Revision Books

With help from the LRC, we also organised a Revision guide donation table for GCSE and A-level study aids.

This encouraged students finished with their exams to donate their exam revision resources, allowing students in need of revision books to help themselves. We were aware that these can be extremely expensive, especially when students need one for each of their GCSE subjects

This allowed all students to have access to materials that would help them get the best grades possible.

It is a core objective of the Environment Club to lead the way for the school to be imaginative in every possible way to enhance recycling.

Green Fingers

Throughout last year, we were eager to plant some greenery around the school to make the area pollinator-friendly, especially as spring neared.

Stat point: 42% of pollinator species have become less widespread over the long term in the UK so we were passionate about making even a small change to our local environment.

We raised money through a sixth form mufti day for World Wildlife Day, allowing us to raise awareness for the world's wild fauna and flora and purchase our own flora.

Our pollinator-friendly plants were planted at the front of the school's GUTP building.



Bug Paradise



Along with the plants for our local pollinators, we also made a bug hotel for the insects that are also an important part of wildlife.

Bug Hotels are imperative for the continued survival of urban insects. Ladybugs, arachnids, woodlice and other common British insects will thrive in the nooks and crannies of the hidden spaces provided.

Hot on the footsteps of earlier members of the Environment Club, who made such a structure, we established a bug hotel to promote biodiversity in the school grounds.

Our first project of this school year was a Halloween Costume donation. 40% of Halloween costumes are only worn once so we wanted to give students the opportunity to reduce the amount of materials they use and allow them to have a new costume for Halloween without

having to pay for it. Also, donating last year's costumes instead of throwing them away helped us not contribute to the 85% of halloween costumes that eventually end up in landfill.

Eco club is also planning to take care of our school's environment through litter picking. The next project on our ever-growing list is to create a litter picking rota so we can clean up Sponne as well as raise awareness of the impacts to the environment that littering causes. We hope to encourage students to find a bin for their wrappers rather than using school grounds as a place for waste.

Shin Pads

Shin pads play an important role in injury prevention as they are intended to protect the shin from injury. "Micro" or "Mini" shin pads may therefore increase the risk of injury due to the smaller amount of shin covered compared to larger sized shin pads. We advise that when considering the protection offered by shin pads, safety is prioritised by ensuring a good proportion of the shin area is covered and therefore protected.


