Year 9 Classical Civilisation

Year 9 Classical Civilisation students at Sponne visited the University of Leicester on 6th November for the inaugural Ancient World Student Annual Meeting (AWSAM@Leicester). They attended a series of seminars on topics linked to their course, including the depiction of foreigners on Greek pottery and how Herodotus (known as the 'first historian') presents the Athenians during the Persian Wars. This was followed by a hands-on 'Careers in Archaeology' workshop. The afternoon finished with a lecture given by Professor Tom Harrison, Keeper of Greece and Rome at the British Museum, entitled, 'What more can you say about the Parthenon Sculptures?' This was a wonderful opportunity for our students to experience a university environment and the different styles of teaching there.

We are grateful to the Classical Association for a generous grant that covered the travel costs of this trip and to Classics for All for their support in setting up the GCSE Classical Civilisation course, which is available to Sponne students for the first time this year.



Extra Curricular Football & Futsal

Another busy term of football, despite the nights drawing in, and some extremely wet weather. We continue to be impressed at the numbers of students regularly attending the after school sessions offered. We've even had time to fit in some futsal, to expand our extra curricular offering. (Futsal is the FIFA-recognised form of small-sided indoor football - typically faster and more intense than football, played with a heavier and smaller ball.)

Reminders

- <u>Shin Pads</u> Shin pads play an important role in injury prevention as they are intended to protect the shin from injury. "Micro" or "Mini" shin pads may therefore increase the risk of injury due to the smaller amount of shin covered compared to larger sized shin pads. We advise that when considering the protection offered by shin pads, safety is prioritised by ensuring a good proportion of the shin area is covered and therefore protected.
- Refereeing & Coaching Courses We We are keen to support any student who is interested in refereeing. Students who are in Year 9, or above, can find some information here; bit.ly/Referee2324. 



<u>Sponne Uniform</u>

Blazer

All students should wear a black blazer with the school logo sewn onto the left hand pocket. No hoodies are allowed.

Students may wear a plan black, V-neck jumper under their blazers. The jumper should not be worn instead of the blazer.

Trousers

Black tailored trousers (e.g. not skin tight/skinny, jean or legging style, or showing the outline of the leg). Trousers must be worn around the waist (above hips - no underwear should be on show.) Buttons and zips should be functional. Belts - Optional but must be plain black.

Skirt

Black skirt length should be knee Length and pleated. Lycra, mini or tight skirts are not permitted. Skirts should be worn with black/flesh coloured tights or socks.

Shirts should be plain white and tucked in. If you wish to wear a white T-shirt underneath you can, but this should not be visible.

School Tie

Top button to waist in length. Clip ties are compulsory for students in years 7 and 8 with standard ties for year 9, 10 and 11 and are available for purchase from the school shop.

Shoes

Shoes must be plain black and flat. No logos/branding, boots, trainers or canvas shoes/pumps (ie Converse, Vans or similar)

Jewellery and accessories

Two small stud earrings in each ear and a watch. No other jewellery is permitted. Body piercings, ear spacers, nose studs, lip or tongue piercings, 'Bling' or pearl, hooped or dangly earrings are not allowed. The use of plasters to cover items of jewellery is not acceptable, nor is flesh/clear coloured jewellery.



Student Gmail

Students are responsible for accessing and engaging with their school email mailbox at least twice per week.

Students must read notices, reply to any requests from staff plus answer any surveys they have been sent.

Email accounts are provided for school and educational purposes.

Students in Y7-9 are supported with this, in time allocated during Computing lessons.
