Congratulations to Sponne Brass Band & Jazz Orchestra who have been invited to preform in the Birmingham Symphony Hall on July 5th. Sponnaissance (our Renaissance madrigal and instrumental group) have also been invited to perform in the CBSO centre on the same day.



Congratulations also to Melody Powell and Katie Skey who have been very busy in recent weeks representing Sponne and

Northamptonshire at a national and european level. In the first week of the Easter break, Melody and Katie attended the National Youth Brass Band of Great Britain residential which culminated in concerts at the Dora Stoutzker Hall in Cardiff and the Yoko Ono Lennon Hall in Liverpool. Careers Fair

This term saw our inaugural Careers Fair for students. The response from local businesses as well as colleges, apprenticeship providers and universities was amazing. We had over 45 different stands for students to interact with and the feedback from both students and attendees was so positive:

"Students that engaged had very good questions and were interested to engage in a conversation rather than one question"

"As a construction company it was good to have a lot of girls talk to us about different routes into the industry. I would say Year 11s definitely engaged more and we had some girls ask for details to speak to us about doing work experience over the summer."

"The option to have a private Q&A with different colleges about different courses was very helpful in deciding future career paths"

"I really enjoyed learning about where I can take my career in the future whether that's an apprenticeship or a university"

Year 12 Work Shadowing

Students in Year 12 have just finished a very successful week of work shadowing; with students going to a wide range of work places including, universities, engineering firms, solicitors, the National Trust and more. Many placements were local, however some students were in different parts of the country and even a couple secured placements abroad. We thank all our employers for their support with this valuable opportunity for our students.

Feedback from students has been very positive, with one student emailing her teacher to say how they could see the links between their A level Sociology course and their work placement. Our students had glowing reports from employers and were often asked to present reports about their placements to members of the teams they were working with. For example, one of our students, working with Barwood Capital, assisted with various research projects including the housing market in Northampton, B Corp and Residential Developers. He presented a presentation on Barwood, and also went out on site to one of our Residential sites.

Navigating exam season Supporting your child to beat exam stress

Exams can be a challenging time for young people, and many young people can feel worried and stressed in the lead up to exams. As parents and carers, it can be difficult to know what we can do to support them. We've shared some tips on supporting your child if they're feeling stressed about exams.



Look for signs of stress

Stress can present differently in everyone. Signs of stress could include not sleeping or sleeping more than usual, losing interest in food or eating more than usual, being irritable, having headaches or stomach aches, being negative, feeling hopeless, or not enjoying activities they previously enjoyed.

If you notice your child is struggling, ask them what you can do to help them.



Talk about stress and nerves

Remind your child that it's perfectly normal to feel worried or stressed about their exams. The key is to put these nerves to positive use.

Talk openly about how you cope with your own stressful situations, so your child has a positive role model for managing their emotions and time.

Practice relaxation techniques with your child, we love these ideas from from NHS Scotland.



Support your child to create a routine

Routines and rituals can help your child keep healthy habits, and can help you ensure your child is getting enough sleep and eating well.

If they haven't already, encourage your child to create a revision plan or timetable, splitting their day up into chunks. Encourage them to take regular breaks - which they could use to have a meal, get some exercise or unwind – and try to discourage them from staying up late revising.



Navigating exam season Supporting your child to beat exam stress



Try not to add to the pressure

Many young people feel pressure to do well in their exams to make their teachers, or families proud. Try not to add to this pressure. Be reassuring, positive, and help put things into perspective. Remind them that there is more to life than their grades, and their results don't define who they are. Reassure them you will be proud of them 'no matter what'.



Make yourself available to listen

Sometimes your child may not want to talk, and it's important we don't force them to have a conversation they don't want to have. Make yourself available but don't pressure them to talk.

You may find that your child opens up in situations where they feel less pressure – for example when you're in the car on the way home from school, or during a walk



Help them unwind after exams

Find ways to help your child unwind after each exam, so they don't dwell on things they could have done better or differently. After each exam, you and your child could watch a film or enjoy your favourite meal together, before they start revising for the next test.



Seek additional support

If you're concerned about your child's stress, or find they don't want to talk to you, encourage them to seek support elsewhere. This could be someone at their school, or an organisation such as Shout or Childline.

We also need you to support our events this year. Look out for announcements from the PFA and join in!


