### Catch-up Premium Plan

Date: 1<sup>st</sup> October 2020

#### Context:

In recognition of the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on the loss of learning of young people in schools the Secretary of State for Education is providing £80 per pupil in Years 7-11 to Sponne School based on the October 2019 census numbers. This money must be spent in supporting students who have suffered most during the lockdown and need assistance in catching up on the gaps in their learning that this situation has caused. The total money allocated includes the Year 7 catch-up money which must continue to be spent in support of Year 7 students who arrive at the school below the baseline in terms of their learning.

#### Allocation:

Total money allocated: £92,640 of which £8,500 must be spent on Year 7 catch-up.

#### Identification of students who will benefit from this premium:

Initially the remote learning logs will be used to identify students who were less engaged with the set work during the lockdown period. Once the first progress point data has been entered this can then be used to evaluate those identified and modify the provision.

#### Proposed use of funds:

The Year 7 catch-up funds will continue to be used in similar ways to previous years.

The remaining £84,140 will be spent in the following ways:
